Edict of the Sakyong Wangmo

**The garland that binds the kingdom**

*From the realm of the Primordial Rigden arose the sacred vision of Shambhala.*

*From the unconditional abode of the supreme drala, Shiwa Ökar, arose the royal lineage of Shambhala.*

*From the luminous mandala of the Father and Mother lineages arose the warriors of Shambhala.*

*From the palace of Kalapa shine the rays of the Great Eastern Sun that bring to fruition the Kingdom of Shambhala.*

Holding the lineage of the Mother warriors, protecting the sublime heritage of Great Gesar of Ling, and suffused with the blessings of the imperial dralas, I, the Sakyong Wangmo, hereby dedicate myself, wholeheartedly and with the utmost devotion, to fulfilling the sacred vision of Shambhala.

I humbly take upon myself the task, requested of me by His Holiness Penor Rinpoche at my empowerment, of manifesting the path of virtue. Faith is the first virtue: faith in the lineage and faith in the teachings.

Therefore, as the Sakyong Wangmo, it is my heart wish to offer profound loyalty and commitment to the Tridzin, the throne holder of the mandala, the Kongma Sakyong, Jampal Trinley Dradul.

From the root of this commitment, radiating throughout our mandala, will come peace and harmony. From peace and harmony comes culture. From culture comes prosperity. This is the garland that binds the kingdom.

In this way, during the period of my reign, in loyal service to His Sacred Majesty, the Kongma Sakyong, I shall devote myself to the well-being of our society.

Let our decorum as practitioners shine through our disciplined, compassionate and wise ways, always supporting the priceless gem of the teachings and practices we hold.

Our community is precious. It is the jewel that supplicates the teacher, evokes the teachings and sustains us on the path of enlightenment. Let our gatherings and celebrations be filled with richness and genuine joy. Let us care for and appreciate each other. Let us cherish the families of our community and their children. Let us always extend ourselves to those who are different, to those in pain or in need of help. Let everyone who passes across the threshold of Shambhala, wherever that may be, feel our warmth and our welcome.

Shambhala is a culture. Our vision takes form not only through meditation and study, but also through society and the dignity of culture. Let the contemplative practice of the arts flourish throughout Shambhala. Let dance, movement, painting, calligraphy, chado, ikebana, kyudo, mudra and the other arts find their place, be welcomed and unfold graciously throughout the kingdom.
